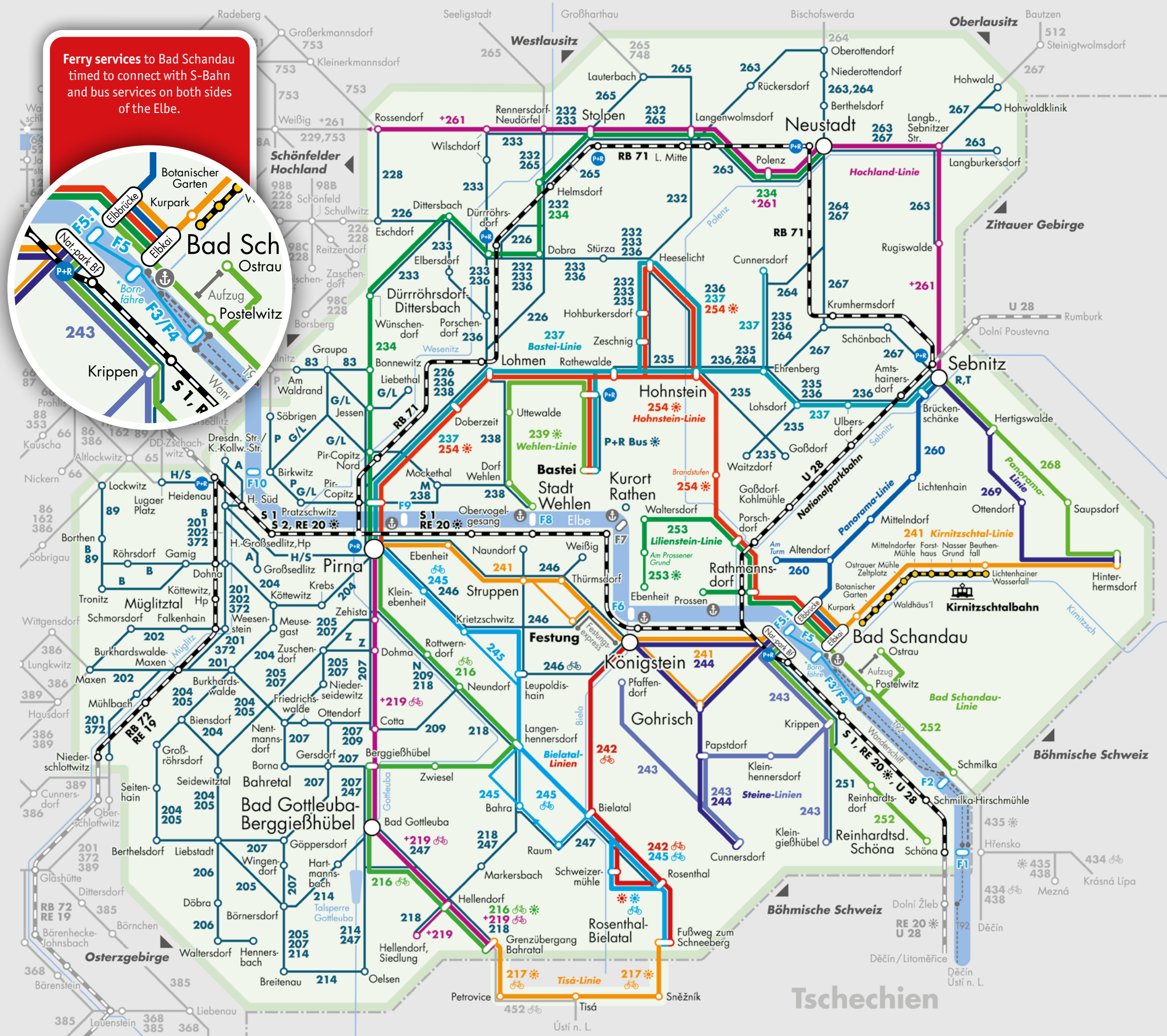

Saxon Switzerland Mobility Guest Card: Your ticket for buses, trains, ferries and Kirnitzsch Valley Tramway

The Saxon Switzerland Mobility Guest Card is issued directly by the host in all participating communities. It can be used on buses, trains and ferries as well as on the Kirnitzsch Valley Tramway and the cross-border 217 Tisá Line.

Please note: It is not valid for the Kurort Rathen ferry, the Hiking Boat (Wanderschiff) or any private bus and boat services. Additional tickets are required when travelling with dogs and bicycles.

A connecting ticket must be purchased for journeys beyond the Saxon Switzerland tariff zones – for example to Bohemian Switzerland or Dresden. The Saxon Switzerland Mobility Guest Card is non-transferable and is only valid in combination with a valid photo ID. For group tickets, the named individual must be present during travel and able to provide identification.

Exploring by road, rail and river

Hiking and Bike Bus Services

The route network map shows you how to get to the most beautiful destinations in Saxon Switzerland. Many bus services operate hourly from April to October. On weekends and public holidays, special Bike Bus Services (FahrradBUS) with bicycle trailers that can also carry e-bikes provide a convenient way of reaching the starting points for many popular cycling routes.

S-Bahn, RB 71 and U 28 National Park Railway

The S-Bahn line 1 is the principal form of public transport along the Elbe in Saxony and runs at 30-minute intervals. There are numerous means of onward travel by train, bus or ferry from its stopping points. The RB 71 train service connects Pirna with Sebnitz. The U 28 National Park Railway is one of Germany's most beautiful railway lines. It runs between the national park regions of Saxon and Bohemian Switzerland at two-hourly intervals.

Passenger ferries and shipping

The Elbe can be crossed at Pirna, Stadt Wehlen, Kurort Rathen, Königstein, at three places in Bad Schandau and



Schmilka and across the border from Schöna to Hřensko. Ferries run from at least 7am to 9pm in the summer. Further information and exact departure times at tvssw.link/faehren

Kirnitzsch valley tramway

The historic tram wends its way romantically from Bad Schandau to the Lichtenhain waterfall, calling at a total of nine stops on the way. All of these are ideal starting points for hiking excursions through the Saxon Switzerland National Park.

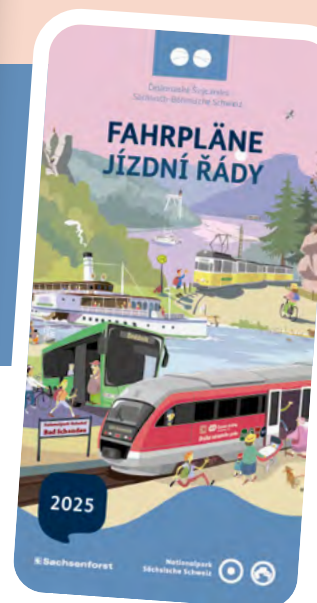
